In Advent, 2011, a revised Order of Mass in English will replace the “interim” Order which the English-speaking Church has celebrated since 1970. Both the priest-presider and the assembly will need to learn their parts anew. For instance, the Greeting, which we speak at the beginning and end of Mass and at the beginning of the Gospel will change:

FROM:

P: The Lord be with you.

A: And also with you.

TO:

P: The Lord be with you.

A: *And with your Spirit.*

FROM:

Glory to God in the highest,  
and peace to his people on earth.  
Lord God, heavenly King,  
almighty God and Father,  
we worship you, we give you thanks, we praise you for your glory.

Lord Jesus Christ,  
only Son of the Father,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
you take away the sin of the world:  
have mercy on us;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father: receive our prayer.  
For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.

TO:

Glory to God in the highest,  
and *on earth peace to people of good will. We praise you, we bless you, we adore you, we glorify you, we give you thanks for your great glory, Lord God, heavenly King, O God, almighty Father.*

*Lord Jesus Christ, Only Begotten Son,  
Lord God, Lamb of God,  
Son of the Father,  
you take away the sins of the world,  
have mercy on us;  
you take away the sins of the world, receive our prayer;  
you are seated at the right hand of the Father, have mercy on us.  
For you alone are the Holy One,  
you alone are the Lord,  
you alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit,  
in the glory of God the Father. Amen.*

FROM:

We believe in one God,  
the Father, the Almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
of all that is seen and unseen.  
We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ,  
the only Son of God,  
eternally begotten of the Father, God  
from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
one in Being with the Father.  
Through him all things were made.  
For us men and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven:  
by the power of the Holy Spirit  
he was born of the Virgin Mary,  
and became man.  
For our sake  
he was crucified under Pontius Pilate;  
he suffered, died, and was buried.  
On the third day he rose again  
in fulfillment of the Scriptures;  
he ascended into heaven and is seated  
at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead,  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
We believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds  
from the Father and the Son.  
With the Father and the Son  
he is worshipped and glorified.  
He has spoken through the Prophets.  
We believe in one holy catholic  
and apostolic Church.  
We acknowledge one baptism  
for the forgiveness of sins.  
We look for the resurrection  
of the dead,  
and the life of the world to come.

TO:

*I believe* in one God,  
the Father almighty,  
maker of heaven and earth,  
*of all things visible and invisible.*  
*And* in one Lord Jesus Christ,  
*the Only Begotten Son of God,*  
*born of the Father before all ages.*  
God from God, Light from Light,  
true God from true God,  
begotten, not made,  
*consubstantial with the Father;*  
through him all things were made.  
For us men and for our salvation  
he came down from heaven,  
*and by the Holy Spirit*  
*was incarnate of the Virgin Mary,*  
and became man.  
For our sake  
he was crucified under Pontius Pilate,  
*he suffered death and was buried,*  
*and rose again on the third day*  
*in accordance with the Scriptures.*  
He ascended into heaven and is seated  
at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again in glory  
to judge the living and the dead  
and his kingdom will have no end.  
And in the Holy Spirit, the Lord,  
the giver of life, who proceeds  
from the Father and the Son,  
*who with the Father and the Son*  
*is adored and glorified,*  
*who* has spoken through the prophets.  
And one, holy, catholic  
and apostolic Church.  
*I confess* one baptism  
for the forgiveness of sins  
*and I look forward to* the resurrection  
of the dead  
and the life of the world to come.

A: *And with your spirit.*

P: Lift up your hearts.

A: We lift them up to the Lord.

P: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

A: *It is right and just.*
